HRSA Investment to Combat Maternal Health Crisis

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS), Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) has announced an *investment of \$90 million* to improve maternal and infant health outcomes. The funding will go towards taking action on the Biden-Harris Administration's White House Blueprint for Addressing the Maternal Health Crisis.

The Blueprint outlines five key goals:


- 1. Increase access to and coverage of high-quality maternal health services, including behavioral health services.
- 2. Ensure that individuals giving birth have a voice and play a role in accountable care systems.
- 3. Advance data collection, standardization, transparency, research, and analysis in maternal health.
- 4. Expand and diversify the perinatal workforce to provide comprehensive care.
- 5. Strengthen economic and social support systems for individuals before, during, and after pregnancy.
