Social Work Courses

- 51 semester hours of social work core courses
- I 3-credit Introduction to Public Health Course
- 6 semester hours of upper-division electives in social work or related fields with a 'C' or better (2 courses)
- Optional Child Welfare Certificate Program (must apply)



Course Offerings

- The social work major is *not* a fully online program.
- Some courses *may* be offered online but *not the majority*.
- No field courses will be offered online.
- Daytime vs. evening course offerings depend on classroom availability and enrollment.
- Course plan leading *up to* the last two semesters (field internship— Blocks III & IV) can be part-time or full-time.
- All students are full-time in the last two semesters due to field internship.

First Block Courses: Full-Time

- SOW 3113: Human Behavior & Social Environment I (Biology)
- SOW 3232: Social Welfare Policy & Services I (Amer. Govt. & Eco)
- SOW 3203: Introduction to Social Work
- SOW 3403: Social Work Research (Stats)

University Requirements

To be completed prior to Block II:

- Any remaining pre-requisite courses
- 60 credits of general education (AA degree) or FIU University Core Curriculum (UCC)
- Foreign Language requirement (FLENT/FLEX): can be met by 2 years of same foreign language in high school, CLEP exam, two college-level intro courses, one advanced level course, high school diploma from non-English speaking country, or more

Civics Requirement:

• Must complete POS 2041 course (social work pre-requisite) and achieve a passing score on the Florida Civic Literacy Exam or equivalent assessment

University Requirements Cont.

To be completed at latest before application to field practicum:

Global Learning (GL) requirement:

 AA degree from Florida Public Institution - will meet requirement by taking SOW 3233 and SOW 3620

✓AA degree not from Florida Public Institution or no AA - you will also need to take one GL – Foundations course. See advisor.

Field Practicum

- Exciting opportunity to apply what you have been learning in class to the real world (signature pedagogy)
- Discover what you may or may not enjoy
- Requires emotional and physical commitment of time and energy - different than "working a shift" at non-social work job



Field Practicum Hours

Two consecutive semesters at the same agency Most agencies operate Monday – Friday 9am – 5pm.

Fall/Spring:

 I6 hours/week for I6 weeks = 256 total hours

Summer:

21 hours/week for 12 weeks = 256 hours Lottery to complete hours after <u>2pm and</u> <u>on weekends</u>. ALL students are required to complete at least 8 hours during Monday – Friday 9am-5pm business hours

Field Practicum Hours Cont.



Students interning in the spring semester <u>are required</u> to intern at the agency during FIU's spring break. You will not have classes that week, but you will have internship.



Students are allowed TWO personal leave days each semester of the field practicum. Any time beyond that is for <u>emergencies only</u> and must be approved by the Field Office. Please plan accordingly.

The practicum must meet the criteria set forth by the School (see manual)

Matching

Field Coordinator balances:

- ✓ Interests
- ✓ Agency availability
- ✓ Location/distance
- \checkmark Car requirement
- ✓ Language requirements
- ✓ Supervisor/student match

Options discussed in individual interview with Field Coordinator.

Students are NOT allowed to contact agencies in advance.

Students who fail to adhere to the placement process guidelines may be deemed ineligible to enter field practicum and be required to reapply for the following semester.

Background Checks

- Florida Law
- If you have background issues, you must contact Professor Abeloff at <u>abeloffj@fiu.edu</u> to discuss these issues before moving forward in the program. This must be done well before entering field.

Applying for Field Practicum

***Plan to apply for field during the semester before you plan to begin field

Semester You Plan to Begin Field	Application Due Date
Summer	January 5 th
Fall	May 5 th
Spring	September 5 th

 Be sure to go over prerequisites for field (listed in field manual) with advisor before applying for field

Applying for Field Practicum

- E-mail the Office of Field Education at <u>sowpracticum@fiu.edu</u> no later than 12pm on the deadline date for password & instructions to the IPT system
- Fill out application on Intern Placement Tracking (IPT) system no later than 11:59pm on due date for application
- No applications will be accepted after the deadline; applications must be fully complete and signed
- Field Applications will ONLY be accepted via IPT
- Request special employment setting application if interested

Applying for Field Practicum Cont.

- Required online Field Orientation
- Interview with Field Coordinators
- Interview with the agency you have been matched with
- Complete screening requirements
- Make sure to be available during this time period
- Continuously check FIU email for communications, form deadlines, etc.
